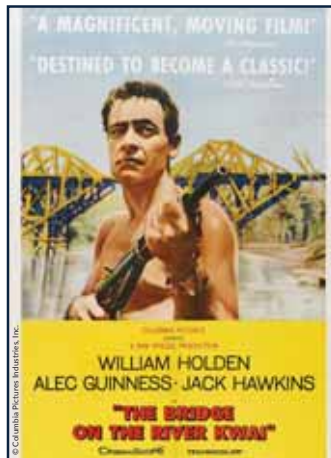


Taxi Driver
